# ABOUT TEXT PLEDGE

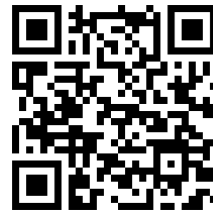

# ANIMAL DIETS



## What do they eat?

**Animal diets are the different foods animals eat** to stay healthy, grow, and function properly. What an animal eats depends on its type, where it lives, and how it has evolved. Animal diets are categorized into three main types based on the types of food they primarily eat.

» Herbivores:

Herbivores are **animals that only eat plants including leaves, grasses, fruits, and seeds.**

Examples of herbivores are **cows, deer, elephants, and rabbits.**

» Carnivores:

Carnivores are **animals that only eat other animals (meat)** for their nutrition.

Examples of carnivores are **lions, wolves, sharks, and eagles.**

» Omnivores:

Omnivores are **animals that eat both plants and meat.**

They can eat many types of food including fruits, vegetables, insects, and meat.

Examples of omnivores include **humans, bears, racoons, and pigs.**

Understanding animal diets and knowing what they eat is very important.

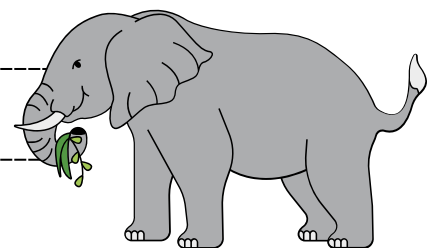

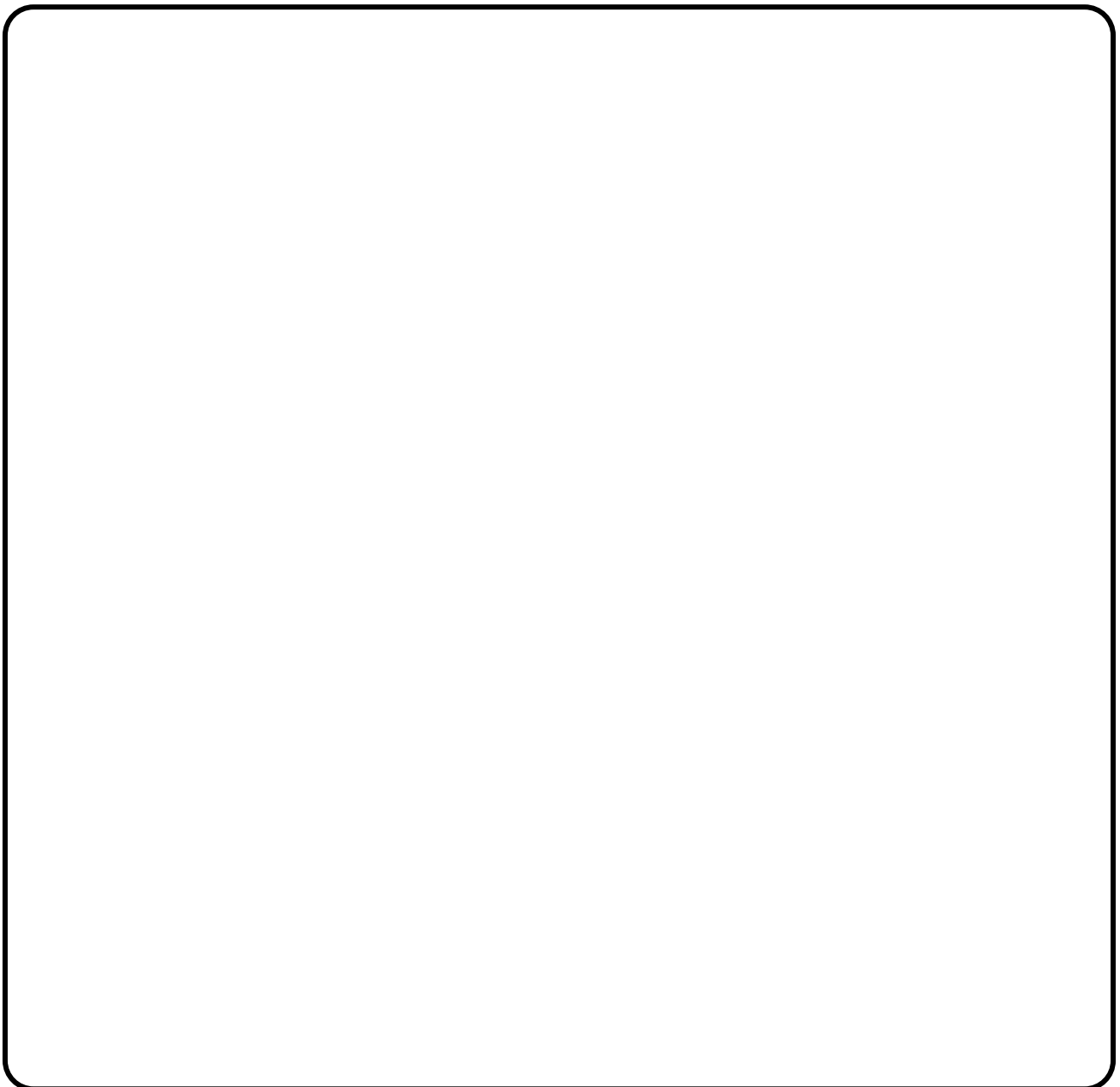
# Be a voice for the voiceless **MAKE A DIFFERENCE**
