Refusing to share toys or games with others.





Arrange all the cut-out shapes so that they fit into the square.












Discrimination can occur without intention. It is important to proactively create environments of mutual respect.




the practice or quality of including or involving people from a range of different social and ethnic backgrounds and of different genders, sexual orientations, etc.

Ensuring that everyone has the resources and support they need to succeed, even if it means providing different resources or opportunities based on individual needs.
